About the Technology Integration Workshop

The Technology Integration Workshop (TIW) is a professional development opportunity for educators to enhance their curriculum by utilizing technology integration methods, strategies, and tools in the classroom. In 2020, the program was transitioned to a virtual format to occur over the course of three days. Participants attended breakout sessions, developed a unit plan, and participated in a virtual job shadow with a business professional.

Program Highlights

Extensive research was done to determine new content that aligned with educators' interests and experiences teaching during the 2020-21 school year, which resulted in 5 new presenters.

The schedule was updated to provide attendees with more collaboration and work time.

The TIW team successfully developed an interactive workshop website, creating an immersive experience for participants.

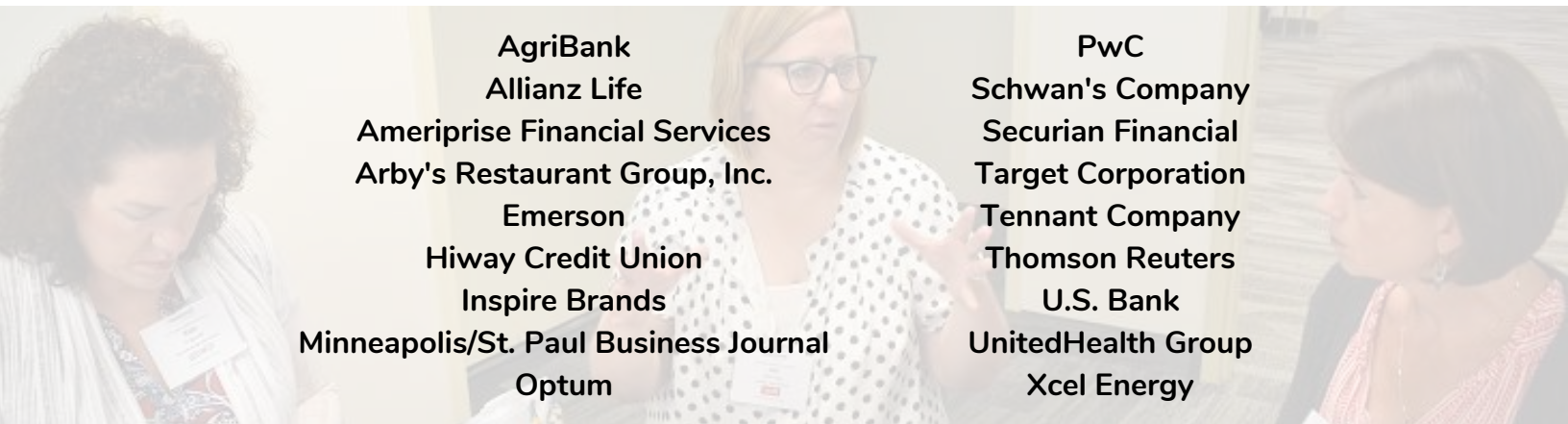

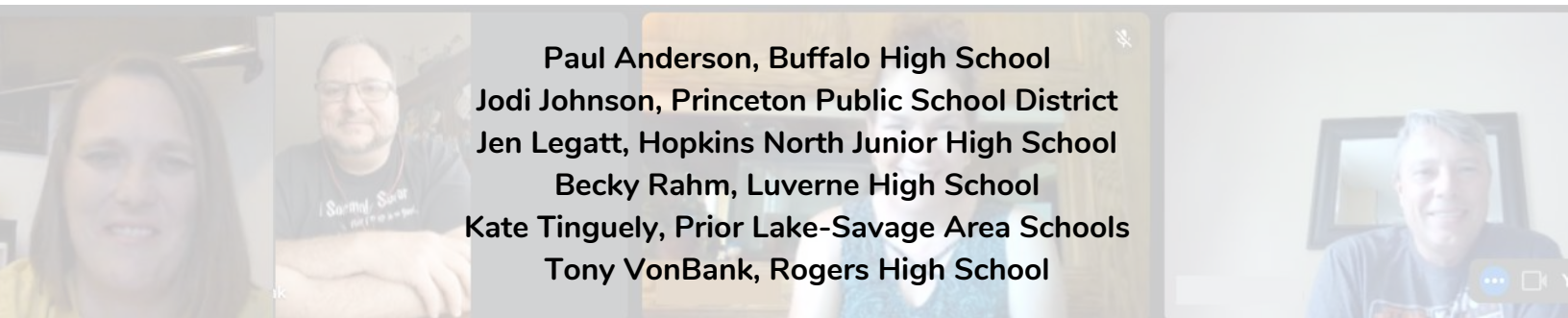
